ATTRACTIONS

Pier Into the Ocean Activities

Students will explore three learning stations during this two hour program. The stations include fishing, fossil hunting or hunt for mole crabs and do hands-on food web studies at the historic Kure Beach Pier. Students will rotate through 3 different stations with 35 minutes of fun at each station. This program also includes a pizza and lemonade lunch.

4th Grade Standards:

Fishing-Animal Adaptions 4.L.1 Understand the effects of environmental changes, adaptations and behaviors that enable animals (including humans) to survive in changing habitats. Fossil Hunt-Earth's change over time 4.E.2 Understand the use of fossils and changes in the surface of the earth as evidence of the history of Earth and its changing life forms.

Island and Sound exploration Cruise at Masonboro Island

Students will take the "Winner Cruise Queen" vessel on a thirty minute ride to the beaches of Masonboro Island. Along the way students will learn about estuaries and their inhabitants. The stations will include the "tidal creek" station with crabbing, the "marsh" station with investigating the life found in a salt marsh and the "beach front" station with shelling.

Highcroft Drive Safety Plan for Carolina Ocean Studies Field Trip

Overall Safety:

Orientation and all activities are supervised by a guide who has trained in related subjects, such as biology, marine biology etc. at college or university. All guides and HDE chaperones must pass a background check. Students receive safety orientation by guides upon arrival at each site. Students are counted regularly at transition times. Teachers bring WCPSS red safety bags and list of parent contacts. Students are assigned to groups with consideration of behavioral issues. A chaperone plan is in place (see attached plan). The entire

field trip and plan has been reviewed and approved by at least 6 individuals from WCPSS Central Services prior to approval which was granted. Dr. Gamble or Mr. Thomas will attend.

Bus Safety:

Students are expected to follow WCPSS bus rules. Teachers are with students on the bus to supervise. Only bus companies that have been approved by WCPSS drive our students.

Medical Safety:

Medications are kept and administered by school staff. There is always a parent with a car for emergencies. Although we have never needed to use these facilities, here are emergency facilities:

Activity Safety:

Chaperones accompany students from one activity to another. School staff members (6 teachers and 1 administrator) are present and available at all times. Guides provide instruction for proper ways to engage in each activity. Students are supervised at all times. An adult always accompanies a student to the restroom.

Boat/Water Safety: Students will wade marshland areas and participate in learning stations at the Kure Beach Pier and on the beach at Masonboro Island. They will not be in water above their knees. They will be carefully monitored by several WCPSS approved chaperones, teachers, and the background cleared Carolina Ocean Studies staff. The "Winner Cruise Queen", a 65' vessel is U.S. Coast Guard inspected and certified.

Chaperone Responsibilities

- Each parent chaperone will be assigned small groups of students to assist
- Chaperones will help students load and unload the bus
- At Carolina Ocean Studies, chaperones will accompany students to all program activities and assist in their supervision
- All chaperones must have a green star clearance (be a WCPSS approved volunteer)

Additional Information, FAQ's

- Parents who are chaperoning may not bring any other children with them on this trip
- Each class will be able to provide bus transportation for up to six parents.
- The cost of parent chaperones is \$67 whether or not the parent rides the bus or drives separately
- Any parents who drive separately have the option to sign their child out at the end of the field trip- their child may ride home with them in their own vehicle
- Students may not drive to the field trip with their parents who are driving separate (all students must be on the bus on the way there)
- If your child has any dietary needs, please let your teacher know. Children may pack lunch if they do not eat pizza or have a dietary need.
